LYO Brandie Beck March 5th is Ash Wednesday, with our evening service taking place at 6:30 Pm. Once again there will be a portion within the service, the imposition of ashes will be offered, as they are placed on the foreheads of those who wish to come forward as a remembrance of our mortality and penitence.

Typically, throughout the course of a given month, when I have an open morning or afternoon, I visit our members who are presently residing at local assisted living or nursing homes, as well as the homebound. For the month of March, I am planning on doing all visits on Ash Wednesday, starting in the morning after dropping my kids off at school. This way, not only can I offer folks communion, but also provide them with ashes if they wish to have them.

For any who are presently unable to leave their homes and desire to receive ashes, reach out to the church, let us know, and I will come by at some point that day. Each year I say this in advance, it is highly unlikely that I will stay as long as normal because of the high volume of visits in a single day, so be aware of that going in. However, I feel the tradeoff is worth it to participate in this ancient rite as we begin the Lenten season.

My request that goes along with my offer: whoever may read this, and are able to attend worship, but think to themselves, well I could go to church, but this would save me a trip; that is not the intention. This is being offered to those who are unable to leave on their own but desire to participate. Simply touch base with us and I will be sure to come out and see you that day.


