175th Anniversary Heritage Sunday Spotlight Luanna Meyer Family by Wanda Krodel

Luanna was in the first class confirmed in English with Rev. E.P. Boening. She also remembers Christmas Day 1946. She was 16 and helped her father, Clipsy Sendelweck, remove hymnals from the burning church. They took them to the home of Clipsy's father, George Sendelweck, which was next door to Luannan's present home.

Luanna also taught Sunday School for many years while her children were in school. She learned many Bible stories with her students.

All four of her children were baptized and confirmed at St. Paul's. My dad, Linus Meyer, served on church council as financial secretary, president & trustee. When he was financial secretary, we kids helped lay offering envelopes in order on our kitchen table each Sunday afternoon. Dad also did numerous repairs at the church doing carpentry.

I too was active in many activities at St. Paul's. This included Sunday School, where I was an angel in one Christmas program; junior and senior choir, until leaving for school in 1967; and Luther League, where I served as an officer.

Martha Buchta and I went to Earlham College in Richmond, IN for leadership training with the Caravaners after a program they presented to our local Luther League. We enjoyed fall hayrides

with area Lutheran youth for a lot of fun. The first LYO rally for our district was held at St. Paul's prior to the first synod LYO assembly at Purdue University, "Lift High the Cross". Youth were active in Sunday School classes with Kenny Fuhrman and Jim Schnarr teaching. We also toured Wittenberg University with Rev. A.D. Rehrig & Joan.

I was asked out on a first date with Larry Krodel after cantata practice on Palm Sunday 1965. Larry and I were both confirmed at St. Paul's and married by A.D. Rehrig in 1968.

We are glad to be back worshiping and serving at St. Paul's.
