A note from Pastor Tim...

I want to express gratitude to Jeff Mann and Terry Seitz for filling in earlier this month. As of this writing (October 16th) Jeff Schmitt has been doing his best to get our monitor up and running with the possibility of utilizing a synod sermon for our October 19th service, more on that in a moment. Not knowing if that will be a reality at this point, Jeff has prepared a sermon just in case, so I am very thankful for his commitment to ensure the 19th is covered in one form or another. We are fortunate to have folks within the congregation and surrounding community that are willing and able to fill in when I am absent.

In the past, I have referenced the pastoral shortage which is running rampant throughout nearly all denominations, but I have never extended that discussion to the pulpit supply shortage is that also extremely problematic. Each synod provides a pulpit supply list of all ordained or synodically authorized individuals to lead worship and offer the sacraments. Our conference, the Evansville conference, has **zero** names presently on this recognized list.

Churches are becoming increasingly reliant on lay people to step up when needed. Knowing that expectation is unsustainable week in and week out, our synod, every Thursday morning at 10:00Am, provides an online sermon and has done so since the start of Covid, rotating amongst their staff. Other synod, having the same shortages, have decided to partner up to alleviate some of the load. Meaning, sermons are provided, in our case, not just within the Indiana Kentucky synod, but all of Region 6 bringing in Ohio and parts of Michigan in as well. Those synod staff members are collectively sharing their weekly messages.

When I take a week off, I realize the Eucharist is removed from the service. The reality is, there is no one in remote proximity that is available and authorized to administer the sacrament, nor are there an abundance of folks that are willing to lead a service to begin with, which goes back to my initial point. We are fortunate to have people that I trust, know are reliable, and willing to lead in my absence.


Visiting report for September was read.
