

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

The focus of this year's synod assembly was understandably centered around the retirement of Bishop Gafkjen, and the election process to name his replacement. Five separate ballots took place in order to determine the new bishop who will begin his time serving that role in the fall. Rev. Timothy Graham was eventually nominated, and while I do not know much about him, I do know he will be leaving his present congregation in Fort Wayne, IN to accept this new role in the synod office. I would suspect sometime next year I will reach out and request that he visits us one Sunday morning so that introductions may be made.

The typical order of events also ensued with worship services, greetings from a variety of individuals and locations, neighboring bishops were in attendance; hearing from a number of them, and a variety of reports were reviewed. All reports can be accessed via the synod website for any who may be interested. We heard from the synod vice president as he provided his report, the synod treasure, secretary, resolutions, credentials, compensation, and so forth.

Concerning attendance, we had 327 voting members present made up of both clergy and lay people; specifically 196 lay and 131 rostered. While the rostered representation was fairly solid, the lay person showing was lower than it ideally would be. I would very much encourage our members to consider attending next year. We will share that information once a date and location are established.



×1 One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)



×5 Five unsharpened #2 pencils with crasers; secure together with a rubber band



×5 Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber



×1 One box of 16 or 24 crayons



×1 One 2½" eraser
